One reason more voters may be motivated to fulfill their civic responsibility this year is the number of local issues on the ballot: Five of seven Steamboat Springs City Council seats are up for election; Routt County is presenting a deBrucing question to fund road improvements during the next six years and other projects afterward; the North Routt Fire Protection District and the Hayden Cemetery District
