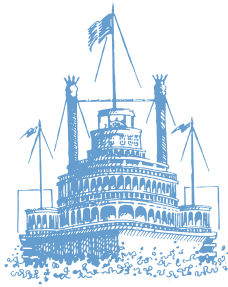

DA candidacy announced

Tammy Stewart looks to replace retiring Bonnie Roesink

Steamboat Springs attorney and former Routt County Deputy District Attorney Tammy L. Stewart is running as a Democrat for District Attorney of the 14th Judicial District. She will formally announce her candidacy next week.

Roesink, a Republican, is retiring at the end of her current term after 21 years as a prosecutor in the 14th Judicial District.

Stewart will be challenged by Grand County prosecutor Elizabeth Oldham, a Republican.

Stewart was a prosecutor for 12 years and served as Deputy

District Attorney in Routt County from 2005 to 2006.

"I left the office because of a difference in management perspectives — there was almost 100 percent turnover while I was a DA," Stewart said Wednesday. "We need to get qualified people that can afford to live here and are satisfied with the management and want to stay."

Since her departure, Stewart opened a private law practice

in Steamboat Springs, specializing in criminal defense and family law. She is a part-time assistant county attorney in Moffat County, where she prosecutes child abuse cases.

"You do this kind of work as public service," Stewart said. "I have the experience right now that our jurisdiction needs to move forward."

"This has been her lifelong
