Faces without places

Panel uses scenarios to look at economic realities of affordable housing

STEAMBOAT SPRINGS

A panel of local officials tried Friday to add a human aspect to the affordable housing discussion.

Economist Scott Ford provided examples for the second forum in the affordable housing series put on by the Chamber Economic Development Council, Steamboat Ski & Resort Corp. and the Steamboat Springs Board of Realtors. The examples, he told the packed house at Rex's American Grill & Bar, were not real people.

But they could be. "Oftentimes, when we talk work force, it becomes somewhat invisible," Ford said. "The names are made up, but this puts a face to it."

The forum focused on the economic realities of housing Steamboat's work force. Ford offered three scenarios: a single woman making \$47,240 a year, a couple making \$66,800 a year and hoping to start a family, and a couple with three children making \$100,000 a year. Options were scarce. Michael Hurley, a developer with ARIA
