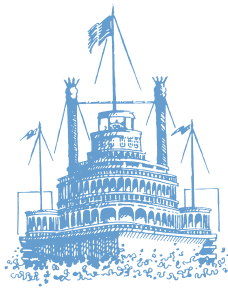

# Death spurs reflection

## Steamboat Springs officials take action after fire in apartment

### STEAMBOAT SPRINGS

City Council members are calling for a review of code enforcement priorities, and city planners hope to inven-

tory Steamboat Springs' stock of secondary residential units in the wake of David Engle's death last weekend in an Old Town apartment.

Engle died of smoke inhalation after a grease fire ignited in his converted garage apart-

ment at 705 Pine St. The apartment had no smoke detectors and is not registered as a legal residence with the city. The city does not actively pursue unregistered secondary units unless a complaint is made. Secondary units are those located on the

same lots as principal dwelling units and include a sleeping area, kitchen and bathroom, according to city codes.

"I think this is a real wake-up call," Councilman Steve
