

City slashes project budget

Antonucci: Finances on a 'collision course'

The city of Steamboat Springs plans to hack its 2009 budget for capital projects by nearly half, and Finance Director Lisa Rolan is predicting an even tougher situation in 2010.

The city originally budgeted \$15.4 million for General Fund capital improvements in 2009. After the city's management team met four times with instructions to slash all but the most imperative projects, the Steamboat Springs City Council agreed last week on a plan that would cut General Fund capital expenditures to \$7.9 million in 2009.

Even with the cuts, the city will reduce its Capital Improvements Plan reserves to \$4.6 million in 2009. There was \$14 million in the capital reserve fund at the end of 2007.

"I do not agree with that low a reserve in your CIP," said Rolan, who urged council members to save at least \$7 million. "The concern I have is, a lot of the projects we're starting in 2009 continue in 2010, 2011 and beyond, and we have to come up with those dollars. (Next year) is going to be harder."
