# Schaffer touts tax relief

### US Senate candidate focuses on economy during Steamboat visit

Republican U.S. Senate candidate and former Congressman Bob Schaffer stressed the need for tax relief and joined John McCain's crusade against earmarks in a Steamboat Springs stump speech Wednesday.
