Unemployment help on hand

Emergency compensation program extended as jobless rates increase

Unemployment is increasing steadily in the state and Routt County, but more relief is available for those who are eligible.

The Colorado Department of Labor and Employment announced in a news release Monday that some people could get as many as seven more weeks of Emergency Unemployment Compensation. The exten- the Steamboat Springs branch centage points from September sion of the program, passed in July, is a result of legislation President George W. Bush authorized Nov. 21.

The state Labor Department will send letters next week to those eligible for the extended compensation.

"We're hoping that helps people here at least get through to the winter, so they can pick up some new jobs if the snow comes," said Brian Bradbury, an employment specialist at of the Colorado Workforce Center.

At the center, interest in unemployment benefits has continued to increase, Bradbury

"It's increasing daily," he said. "And we are having people come in; they have heard about the extension, so people who have run out of benefits are calling in about that.

Routt County's unemployment rate increased 0.8 per-

to October, from 3.2 percent to 4 percent. That figure is not seasonally adjusted, which means it does not take into account the typical shift of employment patterns as seasons change.

Routt's unemployment still is below the state unemployment rate.
