# IPods eye-opening

## Steamboat schools use devices for multimedia lessons

### STEAMBOAT SPRINGS

It may seem a strange place to receive a lesson on sound, but the library at Strawberry Park Elementary School was abuzz with rolling pencils, shuffling papers and spinning globes as a part of a technology-enhanced granted — an iPod. class Thursday afternoon.

Librarian Sherry Holland's lesson to students in Maggie Moore's second-grade class included how sound is made and transmitted and the unique properties of ears. Holland used a sound-making tool many young students already take for

The iPod has become a common tool in the Steamboat Springs School District, after 25 of the devices were purchased for city schools last year through the Education Fund Board, which administers the city's half-cent sales tax for education. Now that teachers are

discovering the uses of sending students home with lessons and the ability to create podcasts for multimedia teaching, district officials hope the program can expand.

They'll have help from local developers.
