# More than an officer

## Carrell takes on many duties at Steamboat Springs High School

handles. Students turn to him for everything from a tough day to a stolen MP3 player.

“School resource officers tend to be a triangle of responsibilities,” Carrell said Wednesday. “Above all, you’re a law enforcement officer, but you’re also a teacher and a counselor.”

Carrell also is a co-sponsor of the junior class, an assistant boys soccer coach, an assistant in a leadership class, a board member on several community committees and a chaperone at sports games and dances.

About to finish his first year at the high school and eighth year with the Steamboat Springs Police Department, Carrell recently was the center of attention when the city of Steamboat Springs turned to

the Steamboat Springs School Board to pay half of Carrell’s salary because of the city’s economic pinch.

The School Board agreed Dec. 1 — after a negotiation concerning benefits — to pay half the salary and some of the benefits for the position. The Steamboat Springs School District will review the position annually and likely will take on
