# City hears softball pitch

## Council considers large men's tournament in light of slow economy

STEAMBOAT SPRINGS

A sports tourism company wants to host a 150-team men's slow-pitch softball tournament in Steamboat Springs this summer — the type of event that has proved politically explosive

for the raucous reputation that Thursday that they are open to accompanies it.

Preferring a much smaller event, city officials have responded coolly to the request from the World Softball League. But given the suffering state of the local economy, a Steamboat Springs City Council member and local restaurant owner said

the possibility of an event that would invigorate an otherwise slow mid-August weekend.

"I think it makes sense to at least keep our options open and see if there's openness to that, Councilman Jon Quinn said. "At this point, I think it makes more sense to keep doors open than close them."

Parks, Open Space and Recreational Services Director Chris Wilson explained his reasons behind preferring a smaller event at Tuesday's meeting of the City Council. Years ago, softball players gave Triple
